The Local Government Areas (LGA) have been declared eligible disaster areas activated under the joint Commonwealth-State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) due to the flooding and wind damage caused by Severe Tropical Cyclone Seroja in south-west Western Australia, 11-12 April 2021.

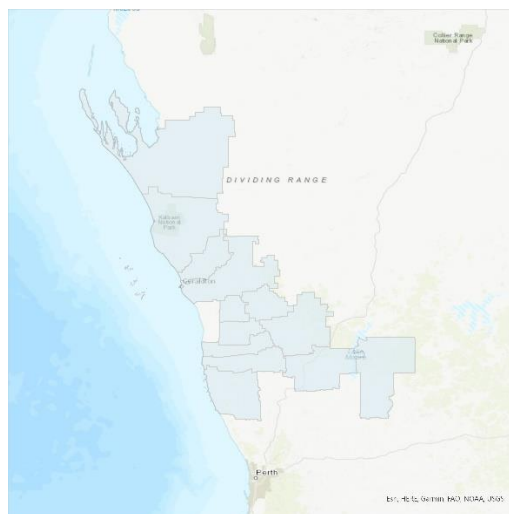


Image showing the 2021 Eastern Australia storms and flooding areas
