Child Support Program - September quarter 2024

Child Support is a private transfer of money between separated parents for the support of their children.

About Child Support

The objective of the Child Support Scheme is to ensure that:
- parents share in the costs of supporting their children according to their financial capacities

- adequate financial support is available to all children not living with both parents
 Commonwealth involvement and expenditure is limited to the minimum amount necessary for ensuring children's needs are met
- work incentives for both parents to participate in the labour force are not impaired, and
- the overall arrangements are non-intrusive to personal privacy and are simple, flexible and efficient.


Cases that involve parents/carers who transfer child support through Services
Australia are referred to as Agency Collect Cases. Cases that transfer child support
by private arrangement are referred to as Private Collect Cases.




Despite the 6.7% reduction in child support active cases from September 2020 to September 2024, the percentage of Agency Collect has been increased 0.7% (from 50.1% in September 2020 to 50.8% in September 2024).



The majority (around two-thirds) of payees have care of their child support child for more than 313 nights a year, whereas the majority (around two-thirds) of payers have care for less than 52 nights a year. Over 15% of child support parents have shared






In the September quarter 2024, the median adjusted taxable income for payers in Private Collect cases is around \$8,550 higher than for payers in Agency Collect cases. For the same quarter, the median adjusted taxable income for payees in Private Collect cases is around \$1280 lower than for payees in Agency Collect

The median annual assessment for Private Collect cases is much higher than for Agency Collect cases across all quarters.



Declared taxable income was used to calculate child support payable for the majority (around 62.3%) of payers in active cases for September 2024 and the proportion has remained stable over last few years.

Minimum annual rate, September quarter 2020 to September quarter 2024




In the September quarter 2024, more than 112,000 cases were assessed at the Minimum Annual Rate. More than 65% of these were agency cases. The proportion of all cases that were assessed at the Minimal Annual Rate has reduced from around 20.3% in the September 2020 quarter to around 17.7% in the September 2024 quarter.

The proportion of active cases with an annual liability of \$0-\$500 has dropped significantly, from 28% in September 2020 to 12% in September 2024. However, the proportion for below \$2,000 liability has been stabled, from 39% in September 2020 to 34% in September 2024.

Notes

- 1. The number of children includes child support children only and excludes other dependent children
- 2. The data excludes 4,265 children in 2,455 cases for whom payer and payee care details cannot be determined (e.g. data invalid as it exceeds 365 care nights combined). As the care levels that payers and payees have of different children in a case may vary, a payer or payee may be counted in more than one category.
- 3. This figure includes child support received by Services Australia in the financial year for liabilities raised in previous years. The percentage collected for assessments raised in the financial year is not able to be calculated based on current available data.
