Child Support is a Private transfer between separated parents for the support of their child.

The objective of the Child Support Scheme is to ensure that: parents share in the costs of supporting their children according to their


- adequate support is available to all children not living with both parents, Commonwealth involvement and expenditure is limited to the minimum necessary for ensuring children's needs are met.
- work incentives for both parents to participate in the labour force are not mpaired, and
- the overall arrangements are non-intrusive to personal privacy and are simple, flexible and efficient.

Cases that involve parents/carers who transfer child support through Services Australia are referred to as Agency Collect Cases. Cases that transfer child support by Private arrangement are referred to as Private Collect Cases.



-0.7% In the December quarter 2019, child support cases with a liability being collected Privately made up 50% of the active case load, the remaining 50% are collected by Services Australia.









The majority (around two-thirds) of payees have care of their child support child for at least 314 nights a year, whereas the majority (around two-thirds) of payers have care for less than 51 nights a year. Around 12% of child support parents have shared care arrangements. The number of Private Collect parents with a shared care arrangement is around double that of Agency Collect cases.







In the December quarter 2019, median adjusted taxable income for payers in Private Collect cases is around \$14,200 higher than for payers in Agency Collect cases. Median adjusted taxable income for payees in Private Collect cases is around \$860 higher than for payees in Agency Collect cases.






Declared taxable income was used to calculate child support payable for the majority The median annual assessment for Private Collect cases is much higher than for of payers in active cases (around 74%) from December 2015 to December 2019 and the proportion has remained stable over this period.



More than 137,000 cases every quarter are on the minimum annual rate which equates to a child support payment of around \$8 a week. In the December quarter 2019, around 35% of these are Private Collect cases.

The proportion of active cases with an annual liability of \$0-\$500 has stayed relatively constant over the five years to December 2019, with 29% of cases (195,244) having an annual liability of \$0-\$500 in the December quarter 2019.
