

The majority (around two-thirds) of payees have care of their child support child for at least 314 nights a year. Whereas the majority of payers have care for less than 51 nights a year. Around 11% of child support parents have shared care arrangements. The number of Private Collect parents with a Shared care arrangement is over double that of DHS collect cases.





In the June guarter 2018, the median annual taxable income for payers was \$44,966 and for payees was \$22,316.

In the June quarter 2018, median annual taxable income for payers in Private Collect cases is around \$13,100 higher than for payers in DHS Collect cases. Median annual taxable income for payees in Private Collect cases is around \$1,100 higher than for payees in DHS Collect cases.





## Notes:

1. The number of children includes child support children only and excludes other dependent children.

2. The data excludes 5,219 children in 2,856 cases for whom payee and payee care details cannot be determined (e.g. data invalid as it exceeds 365 care nights combined). As the care level sthat payers and payees have for different children may vary, a payer or payee may be counted in more than one care level category.

3. This figure includes child support received by DHS in the financial year for liabilities raised in previous years. The percentage collected for assessments raised in the financial year is not able to be calculated based on current available data.
